Hello Jenna,

I hope this email finds you well. I was at McGill today (this does not happen often this year!) and finally had the opportunity to discuss more with Rola, who updated me on numerous things, including your situation. I am very sorry to hear that things have been challenging for you and I hope that there will be brighter days ahead very soon.

Rola explained to me that you would like to register to the Ph.D. and maybe work under my supervision. For the first part, i.e. your admission to the McGill Ph.D. program, you have to know that all admissions must be approved by graduate studies. If you check on the web, you will get the exact list of requirements. You have to know however that in the IS area, we do not accept students who have not completed their master degree first. It means that before considering admission in our program, it will be essential for you to finish a master degree. You cannot do both in parallel.
